Time-limited condition Z3 (Sector stability and integrity)

- Introduced in July 2020 following a consultation
- Ends on 30 September 2021
 - We will consult if we are minded to remove Z3 before that date or if we want Z3, or similar, to extend beyond that date
- 'Stability and/or Integrity' are defined in Z3 as:
 - o financial and economic matters;
 - matters that may affect or distort decision making by prospective or current students in respect of their choice of higher education provider or course; and
 - matters that may affect public trust and confidence in the English Higher Education Sector.



What does Z3 cover?

- An overarching principles-based prohibition
 - Conduct that in the reasonable opinion of the OfS could be expected to have a material negative effect on the stability and/or integrity of the sector
 - Certain offer-making and advertising and marketing practices
- Within this over-arching prohibition, there are **two** specific categories of conduct:
 - Conduct that is prohibited in all circumstances
 - 'Conditional' unconditional offers to UK-domiciled applicants (conditional on making the provider the first (or only) choice)
 - Making false or misleading statements about other providers
 - Conduct that is permitted in all circumstances
 - Unconditional offers to UK-domiciled applicants in some specified circumstances including for applicants who already hold A-levels (or equivalent) and applicants to creative courses such as art, music and drama, where they are assessed by audition or portfolio
 - Contextual offers



What does Z3 cover?

- Other forms of unconditional offer-making to UK-domiciled applicants and other forms of advertising or marketing for the provision of HE (involving statements about other providers), fall to be considered under the over-arching prohibition
- Where we become aware of an increased risk of a provider acting in a way that may not be compliant with Z3, we are likely to impose targeted requirements for information



OfS Admissions review

- Launched 27 February 2020
- Broad in scope including home/EU/international students, UG and PG, full-time and part-time, mature, distance-learning, work-based learning
- Seeking views on:
 - o Principles for a reliable, fair and inclusive admissions system
 - Ten issues across each stage of an applicant's experience of the admissions process (with respondents invited to identify any further issues)
 - Future approaches including:
 - reforms to the current admissions system;
 - post-qualification offers (PQO); and
 - post-qualification applications (PQA)



Next steps

- Admissions review paused in March 2020 and will relaunch no earlier than Autumn 2021-22
 - Potential significant impact of pandemic on 2021-22 admissions cycle
 - Avoid placing additional regulatory burden on providers
- We will work with students and stakeholders before deciding when and how to relaunch the review
- We are working closely with the sector, government and stakeholders with the aim of making sure that the 2021-22 cycle is fair and gives all students the right to choose the right course for them
- We stand ready to work with government and stakeholders on any reforms to the admissions system that are proposed or consulted on


