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# Background

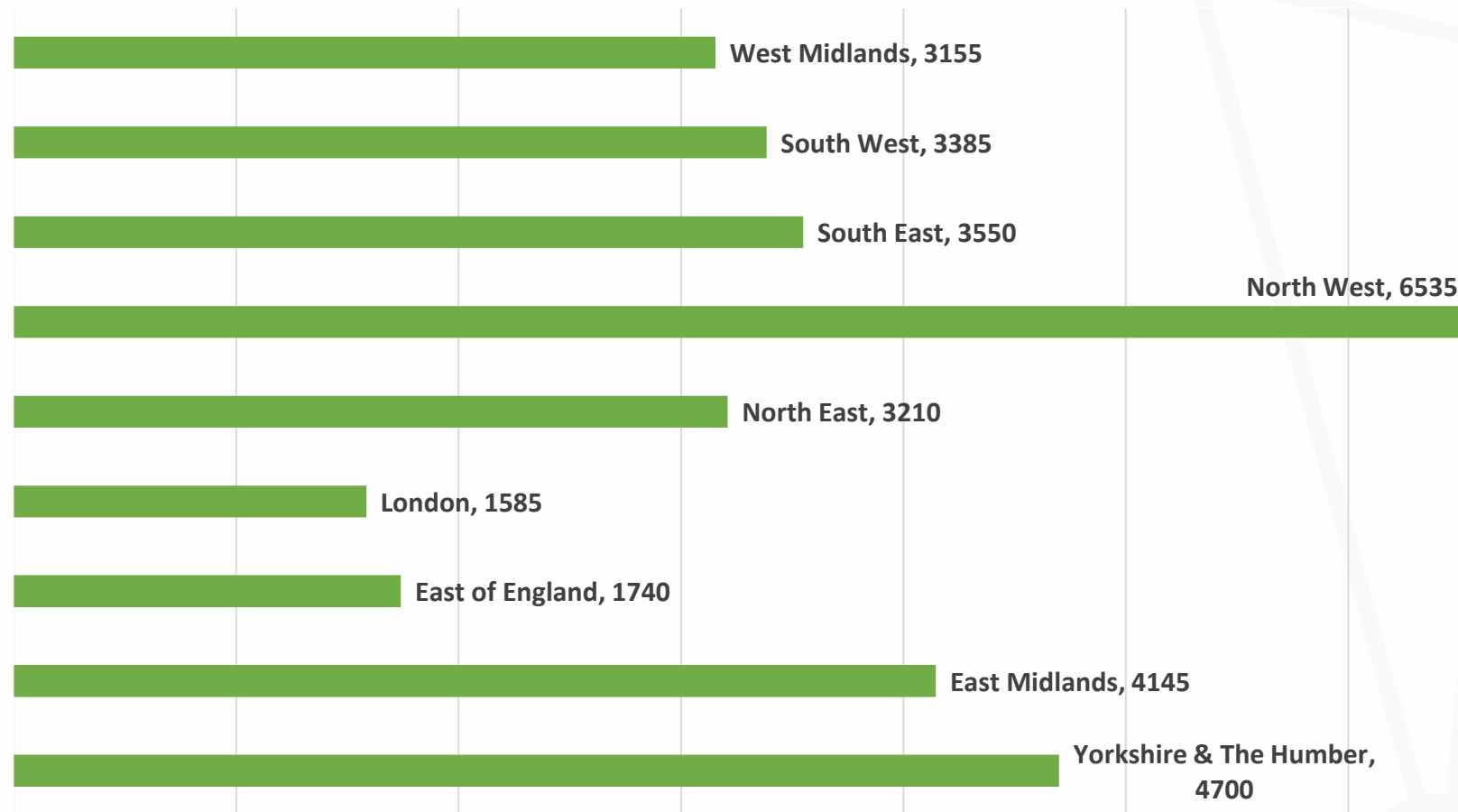
- White young people in receipt of free school meals (FSM) are the least likely, next to those from Gypsy/Roma backgrounds of any group, to enter HE.
- White students make up the largest number of students residing in Low participation neighbourhoods (LPN)

# Methodology

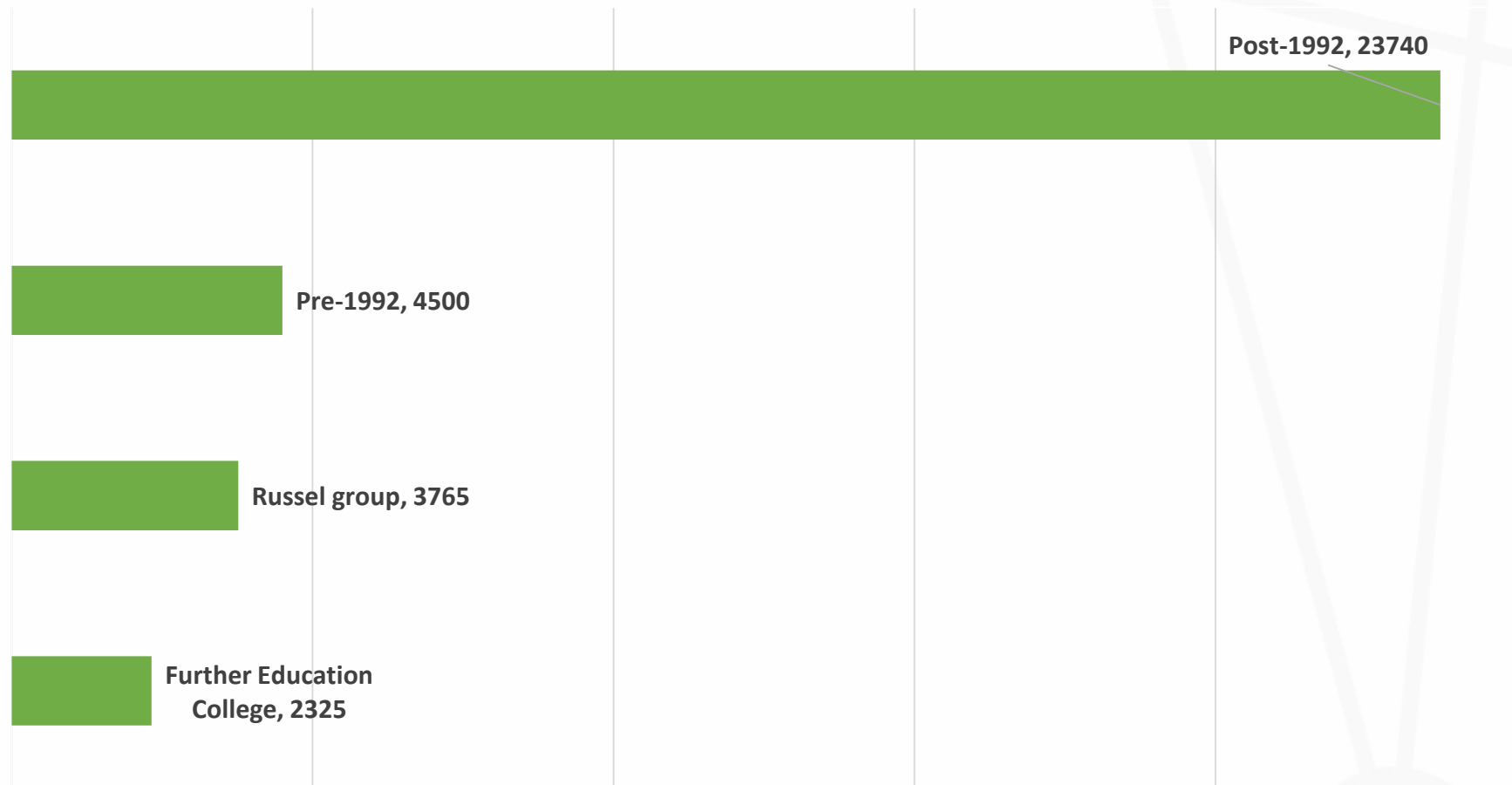
- UCAS data on acceptances and applications, by HEI provider – 246 HEIs in England – White students, 18+, POLAR Quintile 1
- Survey of over 60 HEI/NCOP
- Case studies
- Exploration of APPs



# Current participation: A national picture of acceptances



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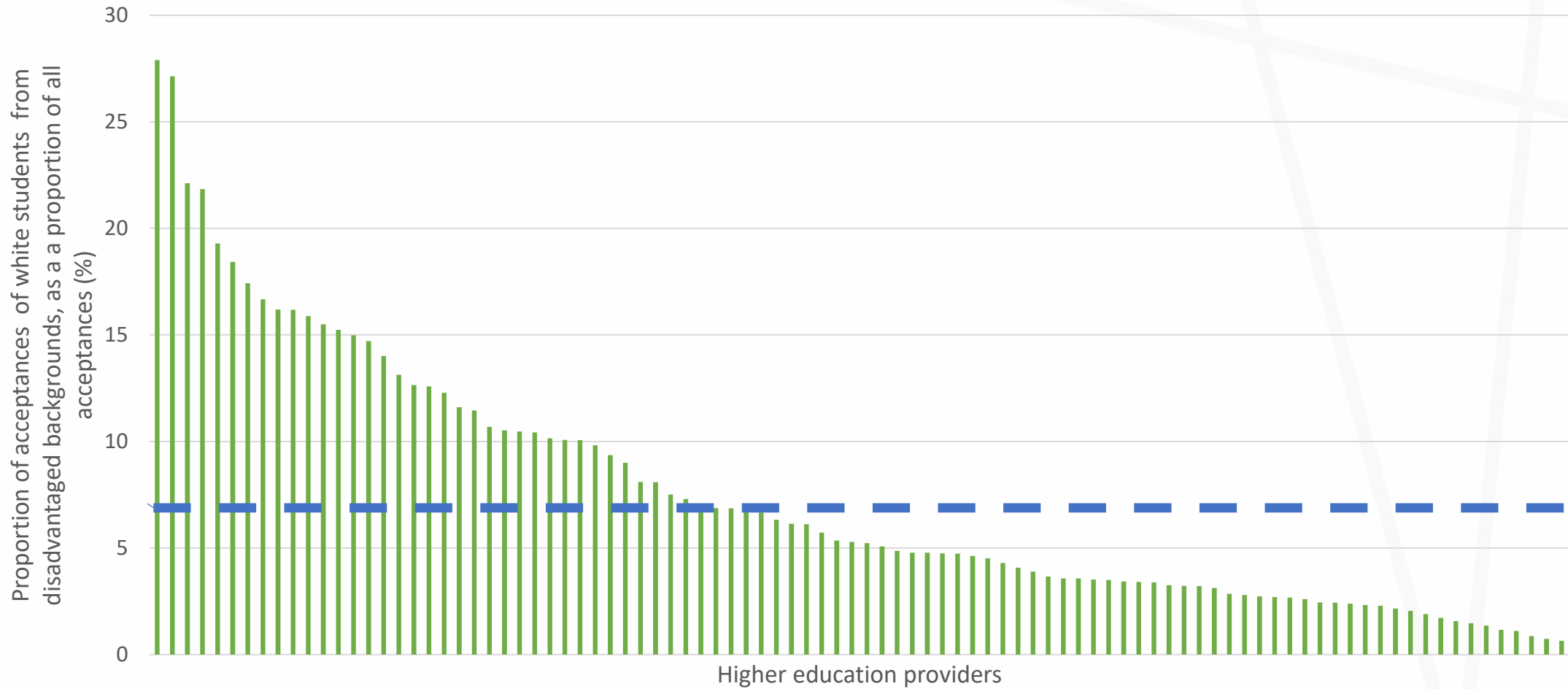


# Measures of participation

- Acceptances - numbers  
3-1190 (all)
- Acceptances as a proportion of applications
- 2-15% males, 3-30% females
- Acceptances as a proportion of total applications
- 11-64% males, 13-52% females

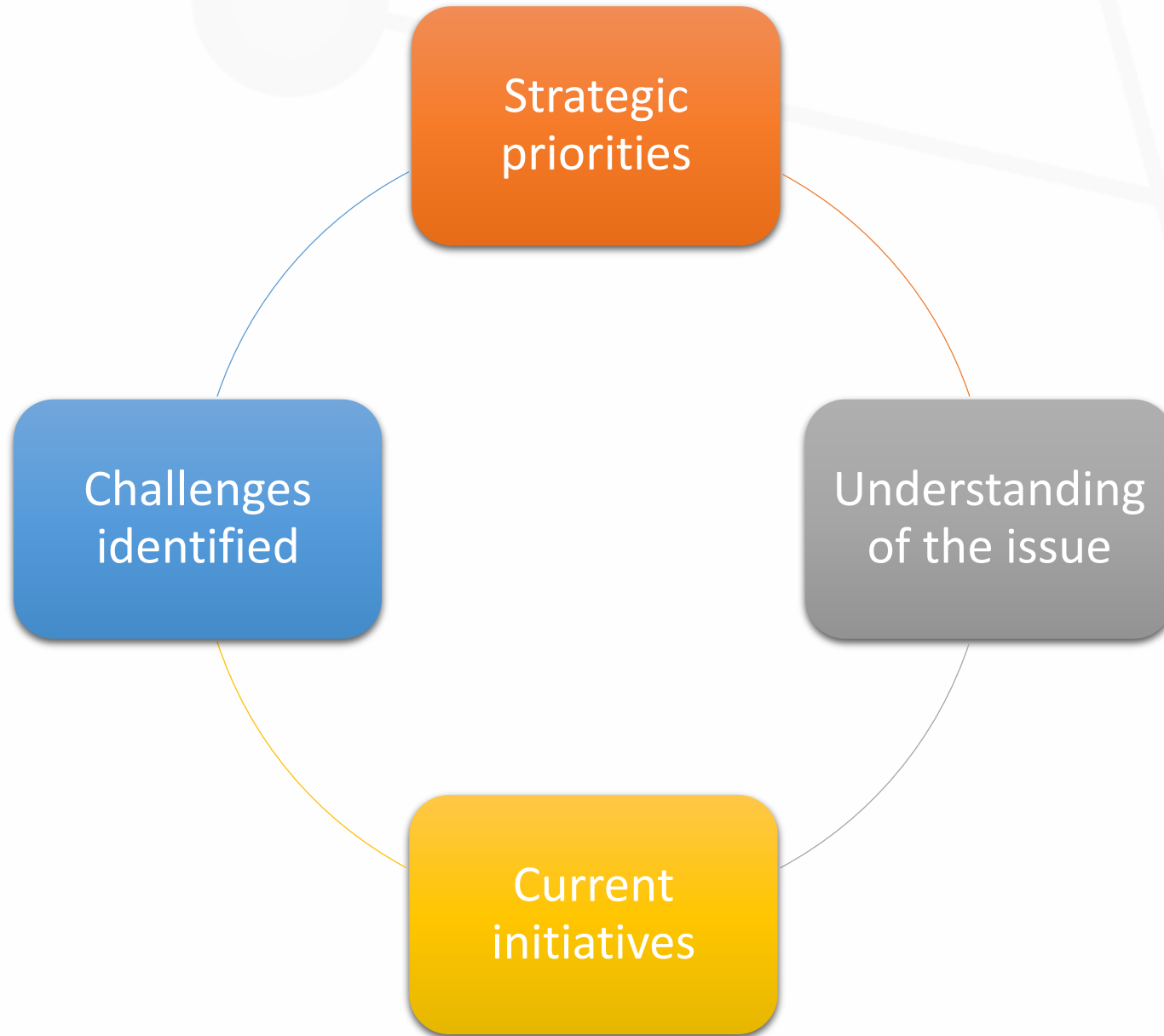


# Variation in acceptances across HEI

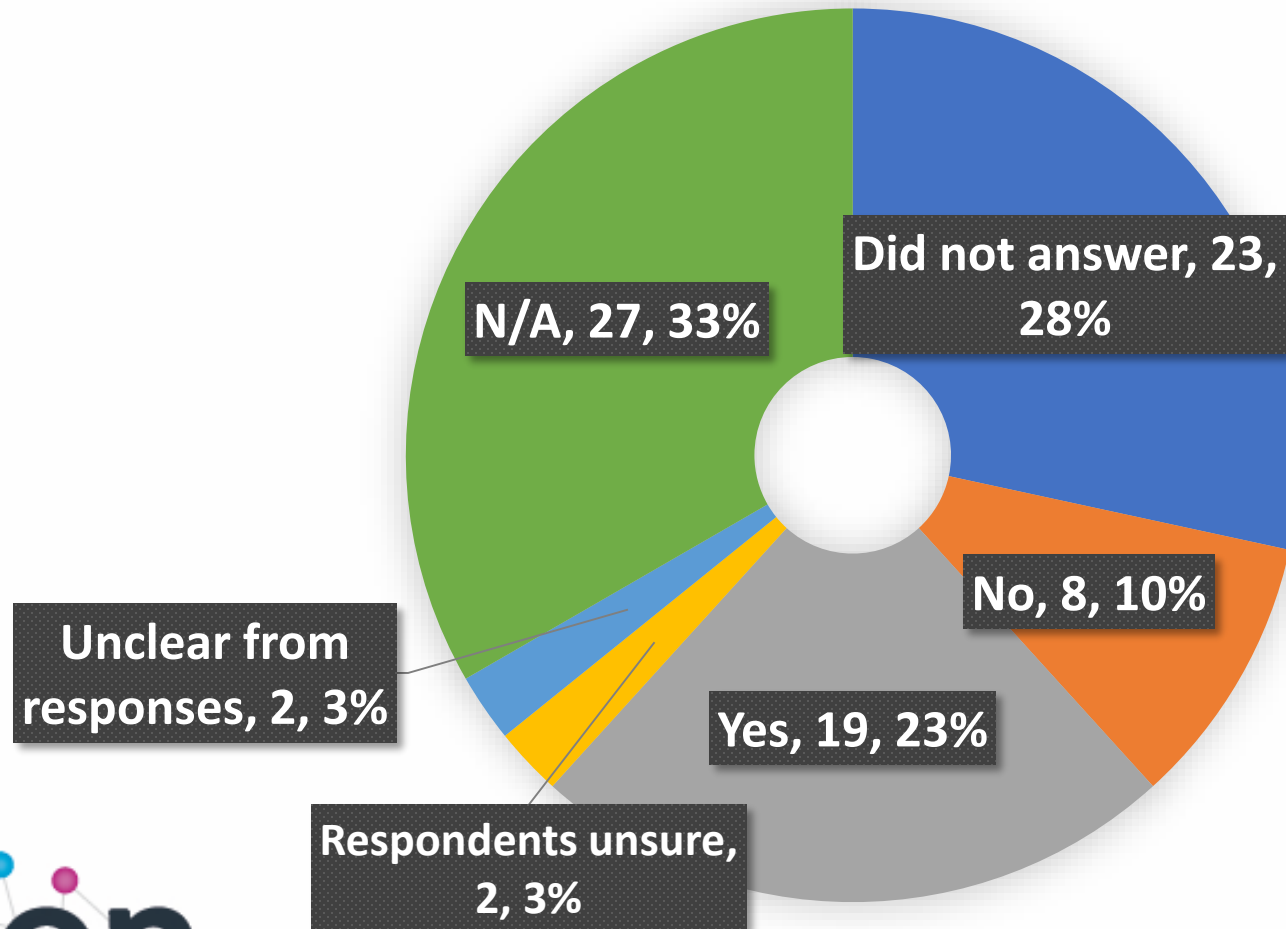


# Variations & consistencies in the HE sector's approach to widening participation





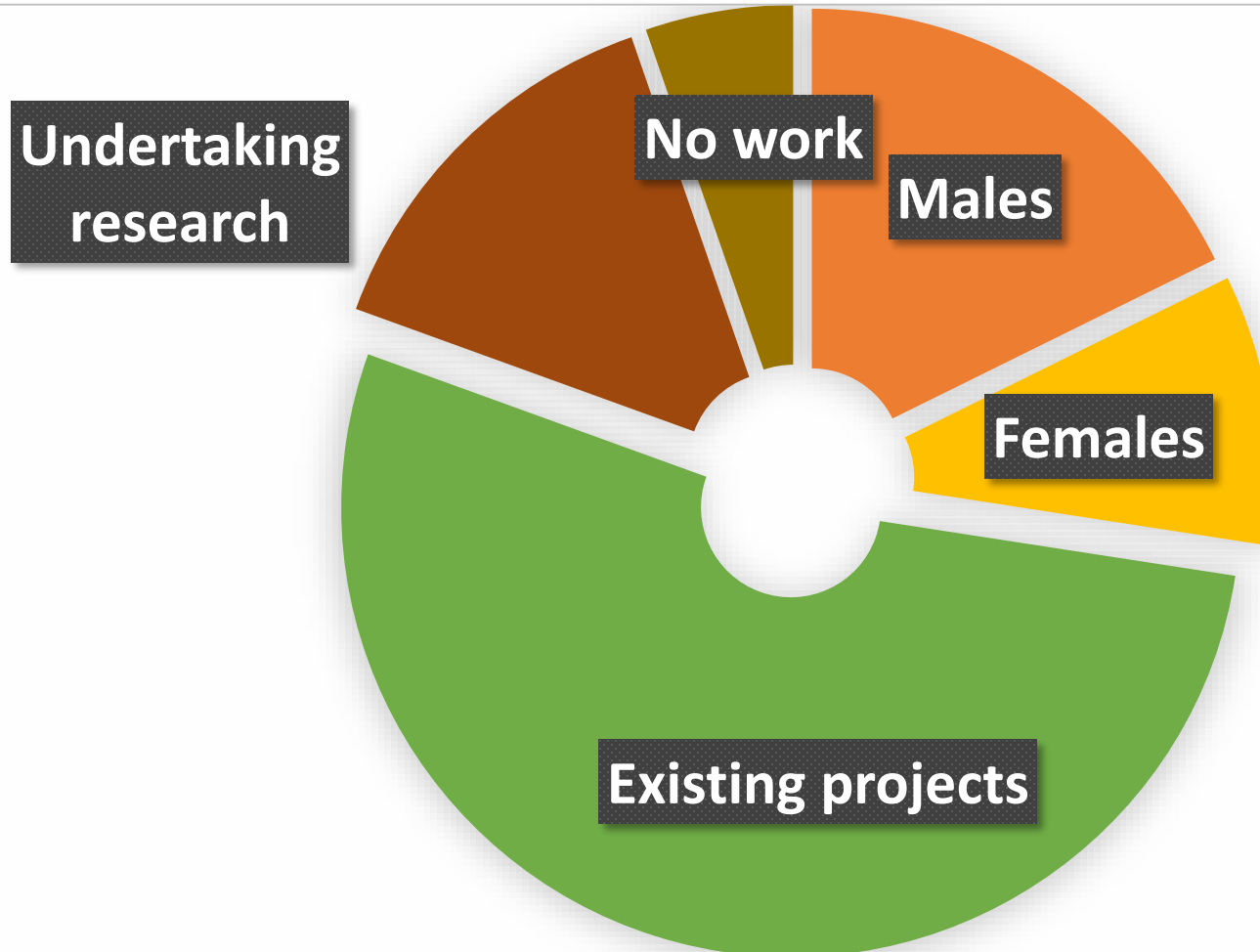
Is work to increase participation, retention and success in HE by white students from low income/low HE backgrounds featured in your Access and Participation Plan?
