First Generation Scholarship Programme

- University's flagship Widening Participation initiative
- A whole student life-cycle approach to widening participation starting in Year 12
- Provides pre-entry support to help access University
- Those who continue to Manchester Met receive financial, professional and personal support throughout their studies
- Helping to break down barriers before, during, and after university



Pre-entry Phase

- Summer University Taster
- Application guidance and support
- Development sessions (incl. personal statements, finance, exam support)



On-Course at Manchester Met

- 'Transitioning to University' event
- £1000 scholarship first year
- London Residential
- Tailored networking opportunities and employability support
- Opportunity to become a Student Ambassador
- Professional Mentoring plus much more...





Response to Covid

- Adding new activities Confidence, Managing Motivation & Coping with Self Isolation, and regular social events
- Online Employer Networking Programme
 - Engaging Alumni/employers through a range of activity
 - Activity spread over a couple of weeks
 - Using a professional platform to replicate the professional environment
 - Retaining cultural elements


Student Numbers

We currently have the following number of students on the programme:


- Year 13 277

Feedback

- 99% of students told us they felt 'very positive' or 'positive' about being on the First Generation Programme*
- 98% of students felt more confident about making decisions about their future*

Looking Forward

- Aim to recruit 1000 students by 2025
- Provisional target of 300 University entrants per year by 2030
- Expanding outside Greater Manchester
- Blended approach to delivery



Lessons Learnt

- Takes time to establish the reputation of a scheme
- Female students far more likely to engage
- Without reduced offers more difficult to engage some learners
- 'First Generation' has a correlation with other WP indicators –
 but (like POLAR) can lead to anomalies
- Our students are our greatest ambassadors
