### 1. Funding by council/combined authority in England

English councils/combined authorities receiving the most funding are outlined in Table 1.

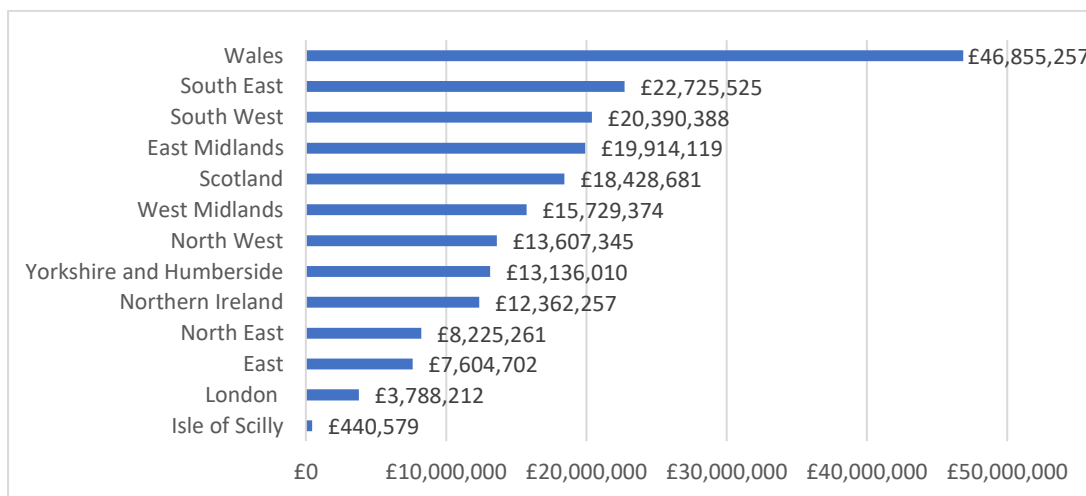

**Chart 1: Funding by UK region**



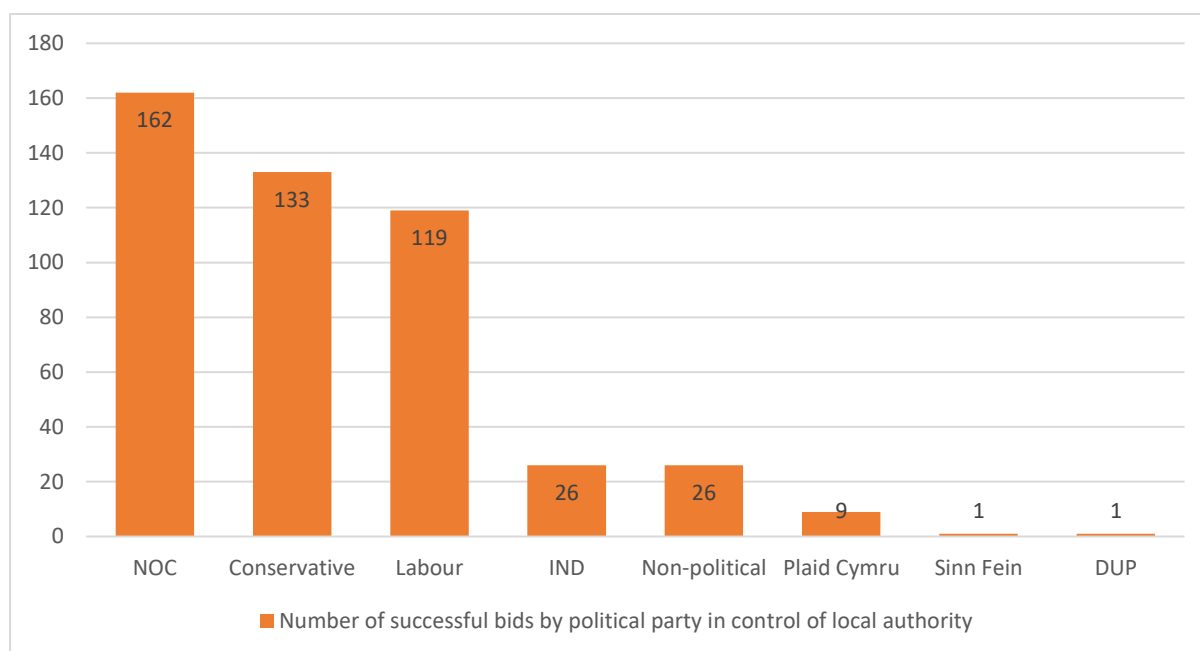
The top three regions receiving the most funding are:

1. Wales (£46,855,257) received 23.6% of funding
2. South East (£22,725,525) received 11.2% of funding
3. South West (£20,390,388) received 10.0% of funding

### 3. Funding by political party in control of area

\*NOC (No Overall Control) are councils where no one party has political control and there is a coalition of multiple parties.

\*\*Non-political refers to funds awarded to charities, universities and other organisations that are not part of a local authority. All these types of bids were awarded in Northern Ireland.

#### **4. Funding by English Indices of Multiple Deprivation**

53 of the bids in England went to combined local authorities which do not have IMD rankings and can therefore not be measured by deprivation.

Of the remaining 172 bids that went to English County or City Councils:

- 23% of bids and 21% of funding went to areas in the bottom 20% of IMD rankings
- 29% of bids and 24% of funding went to areas in the bottom 30% of IMD rankings
- 63% of bids and 66% of funds went to areas **in the top 50% of IMD rankings**
- None of the county councils, except Durham County council, that received funding are in the bottom 50% of IMD rankings.
